



What Defines Volunteerism?

....Being Active!

- Assist before during and after the lunch hours by monitoring the playground, helping students in the lunchroom and cleaning up between the lunch periods with the custodians.
 - A maximum of eight kitchen volunteers will be needed daily. Please call Debbie Berlin, Kitchen Manager at 444-3079 between 8:00 a.m.-10:30a.m. to arrange a volunteer spot.
- Be a room coordinator
- Attend activities: PTA meetings, Reading Night, Fun Night , etc. (1 hour earned per event)
- Assist with Book Fairs in the fall and spring
- Work in the flower gardens
- Assist in the office by photocopying, counting out fliers, etc.
- Help with small groups of students on skills in the classroom
- Assist with extra-curricular activities such as track, yearbook, scholastic bowl, volleyball
- Help in the library
- Attend a field trip and chaperone a group of students
- Participate with classroom projects
- Attend Picnic Fridays-30 minutes per child per family

Limitations on Volunteer Hours:

- Observing/sitting in the classroom and cafeteria does not count
- Doing homework with your child does not count
- Parent-teacher conferences are part of the contract, but does not count as volunteer
- Attending musical programs or skating parties does not count

Who counts as a volunteer?

- Parents, legal guardians, and grandparents only
- Grandparents may volunteer up to 10 hours, the remaining 16 must be completed by parents

Suggestions:

- Parents should make arrangements ahead of time
- Leave small children at home
- Cell phones should be turned off or silent
- All visitors must sign-in and wear a visitor lanyard
- Start early and you will achieve well beyond the 26 required hours!
